

Computer Science



TOP TIPS:

Create revision notes in the format that work best for you:

Mind-maps, flash cards, diagrams, posters or even re-writing out class notes which have been taken during lesson but condensing them to aid revision.

Challenge yourself with various tasks to aid your revision:

Create exam questions on the different topics that you feel could be in an exam, ask your friends/family to ask you a question for you to respond and speak your revision notes out loud as if you were the teacher delivering this content.

Practice exam questions and focus on structure:

Use your notes to answer an exam question in the first instance, then answer the questions without any prompts or notes to advantage your understanding. Remember to consider the structure required for 9-mark questions: state, elaborate/explain and then provide a sporting example to support your answer.

POCKET GUIDE AND GCSE POD:

Make use of the Pocket Guide and use GCSE Pod – these are both fantastic resources to aid revision in a broken down format and with video assistance.




