How can I help?

The MET Disability Independent Advisory Group (DIAG) is seeking panel members to improve the service it provides to D/deaf and Disabled community members and to better understand their needs.

By providing independent advice, oversight, praise and challenge, DIAG and their members, can help influence how London is policed to keep all Londoners safe.

What's the purpose of DIAG?

The DIAG will represent the views of Londoners with disabilities and will:

- Provide relevant oversight of MPS activity.
- Allow the MPS to share proposals for critique in a safe environment.
- Review MPS data and performance.
- Provide support/membership to Gold Groups.
- Raise matters of note or concern from the Disabled Community in London.
- Signpost best practice
- Communicate with the Disabled Community regarding MPS activity



How do I become a Disability Independent Advisory Group (DIAG) Panel Member?

This is voluntary role and D/deaf or disabled panel members should live, work, be educated or have a substantial connection to London.
