I am writing to let you know about our teacher training provision at The Compton School. SCITT stands for School Centred Initial Teaching Training, a one-year school-based teacher training programme which we have been delivering for 9 years that leads to the award of Qualified Teacher Status.

Our school is accredited by the Department of Education to deliver this course and we were awarded an Ofsted Outstanding grade in June 2022.

In practice, this means we can choose from very best available talent and develop trainees into becoming exceptional teachers. Being able to train the next generation of teachers will help us deliver the best outcomes for our students and the schools in our Partnership. Annually, all of trainees secure employment and have embarked on fantastic and rewarding careers, often within our partner schools.

We are looking for candidates with some school experience and a passion for teaching to inspire young people to fulfil their potential. Applicants must have a degree 2:2 or above, provide evidence of an interest in working with young people, possess high quality communication skills, and speak fluently, clearly, and grammatically.
