## **Met Office Extreme Weather Guidance**

### **Arrangements for Tuesday 23, Wednesday 24 and Thursday 25 June**

#### **Tuesday 23 and Wednesday 24 June**

The school day will finish at lunchtime with all students dismissed from 12.30pm.

'Grab bag' style lunches will be provided for students who are entitled to a free school meal.

This is to allow students to take their journey home before the hottest time of the day.

Learning resources will be available on our MS Teams platform for students to access for subject lessons missed and will be based around retrieval practice (visiting and securing recently learnt knowledge).

Students are permitted to wear PE kit to school as an alternative to school uniform if they wish. All students should bring a water bottle to school. Water will be made available throughout the school day.

If students have a hand held fan they may bring their fan in to school, along with a hat. Sun cream should be applied before coming to school and, if required, this can be reapplied for homeward journeys.

Students will be encouraged to remain in shaded areas during break/lunch period and out of the direct sun.

Timetabled PE classes will be adjusted to reflect the hot weather conditions.

We will monitor temperatures in classrooms and re-room lessons to alternative classrooms as necessary.

**If you do not give permission for your daughter to leave the school at the end of the morning session you should call or email the school to ensure that we are aware and we will provide a space for her to remain on site.**

#### **Thursday 25 June - Sports Day at Lee Valley Athletics Centre**

This event will go ahead as planned with some changes to events and **an earlier finish and dismissal time of 1.00pm** in view of the hot weather - please refer to the Sports Day letter attached to last Friday's 19 June parent bulletin.

Students should bring a good supply of water, sun cream and a hat.

In view of the forecast for very hot weather, you may decide that you do not wish your daughter to attend if you feel that the heat will be too much for her to be comfortable.

If this is the case, there will be learning resources available on our MS Teams learning platform and you should ensure that your daughter remains at home and engaged with learning as an alternative to attending the event.

I am unable to predict whether the extreme weather forecast will be accurate but it does seem sensible to plan according to the Met Office guidance and can confirm that other Enfield schools are also arranging similar changes to the week.

Unless you receive further guidance later in the week I can confirm that we will revert back to a normal full school day on Friday 26 June.

I wish you and your family a good week ahead and do hope that you are able to remain cool and comfortable enough.
