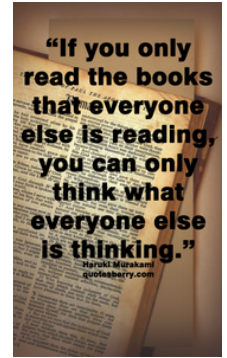

If you are on holiday for results day, you can either a) do nothing and they will be sealed and posted home to the address we have on the system for you at 12:00 noon that day or b) give us the name of the person collecting them for you, in writing, and they must bring ID with them.

Your GCSE examination certificates will be available for you to pick up from mid Nov/early Dec. Only you can sign for them. If you do not come and collect them, we will store them in your file until you do.
