11:30am – 2:15pm Learn how to cook on a large scale. Students will either be making meals for a local homeless outreach (The Little Things UK) or for our weekly community lunch. Students will receive a recipe card and a portion to take home.

We are able to accommodate groups ranging from 8 to 12 students. We ask that students contribute £15 towards this experience. This money will be used directly to support our food bank and hot meal provision.

# Cooking Champions: Student Community Experience

It's nearly that time of the year when Year 12 students have finished their exams and schools are looking for enriching activities. At our kitchen, the only dedicated community kitchen in Enfield, we are offering a unique opportunity for students to run our food bank, help our recipients and have a cooking lesson all in one day.

Cooking Champions is a registered charity focusing on food support, education and training. Since April 2020 we have made over 55,000 meals and currently support about 300 people a week.

### Key elements of the experience

- Run by full qualified teachers.
- A wide range of activities.
- Full public liability insurance and DBS.
- No school staff expected (but more than welcome) to encourage independence and reduce cover costs.
- Students will be given a hot meal for lunch.
- Fully accessible kitchen and cooking facilities.

### Benefits of student participation

- Help people across Enfield affected by food poverty.
- Learn about current issues such as the cost of living crisis and food supply issues.
- Improve team work skills.
- Learn new cooking skills.
- Opportunity to meet other groups in the community.
