UK Parliament Trip

In May, Year 12 Politics students took a trip to the Houses of Parliament, where they developed their understanding of the ins and outs of the systems of government. The class walked through both Houses - Lords and Commons - and learnt about the symbolism and importance of the interior design. They also found out more about the day-to-day routine of MPs and Lords, and were able to read through some legislation that was to be debated on the day. They then ventured over the road to explore the Supreme Court, where they looked through the museum there, and some of the courtrooms.

Students described the trip as a great addition to their political education, as the concepts they are taught now seem less abstract.

Debate Competition

The Enfield County Debate Team (Years 10 & 12) competed at South Hampstead High School in an exhilarating 4-round event; the debate motions covered ideas like feminist priorities, what benefits and disadvantages the neurodivergent community, whether or not citizen's journalism is harmful or not, and whether working from home should be the norm. Parliamentary debate is competed in trios, so the debate team was split into three groups of three.

This was the most successful debate competition yet, with all teams winning 2-3 rounds out of 4! Two trios placed in the top 10, out of 35 teams nationwide! It is such an achievement to place so highly in the nation's biggest debate competition, and every debater who participated should be incredibly proud of themselves!







