Yondr

All students in years 7-10 are now required to have a Yondr pouch if they bring a phone to school.

Students are required to bring their Yondr pouch to and from school each day and are responsible for their pouch at all times.

Pouches have been distributed to all students that have purchased a pouch and as of Monday 18th November any student found to be in possession of a phone not in a Yondr pouch will have the sanctions outlined in our new mobile policy applied.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I want to reach my child during the school day?

We want our students to be engaged in their learning. If you need to contact your daughter in an emergency during the school day, contact the main office at 020 8363 3030.

What if there is a school emergency?

In case of a school emergency, we direct our students to safety first, following our school emergency plan.

Will my child's phone be safe?

Students are in possession of their phone - in their Yondr pouch - for the entire school day. We will advise students to store the pouch in their bags where it is completely safe.

What if the Yondr pouch gets damaged or a student is caught on their phone?

If a student deliberately damages their pouch or is caught on their phone the school will follow the sanctions as outlined in the mobile phone policy.

Damaged pouches will have to be replaced by parents at a cost of £22.50.
