



We want to hear your views about changes we are proposing to bus routes 67 and 149 in north and central London. Route 67 currently runs between Wood Green and Dalston Junction. Route 149 currently runs between Edmonton Green and London Bridge

Summary of proposals

Withdraw route 67 entirely and restructure route 149 to run between Wood Green and London Bridge (on the current 67 routeing between Wood Green and Stamford Hill and the existing 149 routeing between Stamford Hill and London Bridge).

Further details: Route 67

Route 67 would be withdrawn and replaced with route 149. The new routeing of route 149 would keep all connections currently provided by route 67 between Wood Green and Dalston Junction (except Stop N in Dalston Junction Bus Station; passengers use Stop C on Kingsland Road instead)

The new routeing of route 149 would provide new direct links to and from places such as Wood Green and St Ann's Road and Hoxton, Shoreditch, Liverpool Street Station and London Bridge

Passengers who currently travel on route 149 may lose direct links to some destinations, please check webpages, telephone us or write to us to get details

Routes 243 and 279 would not change as part of these proposals and would retain existing route 149 connections between Bruce Grove and Shoreditch (on route 243) and between Edmonton Green and Stamford Hill (on route 279)

The night service on route 149 would not change as part of these proposals. It would be re-numbered as route N149

These proposed changes are part of our work to keep London's bus network reliable, frequent, and easy to use for everyone. They are designed to make sure services continue to meet people's changing travel needs, while reducing unnecessary duplication.
